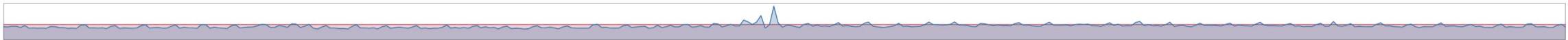
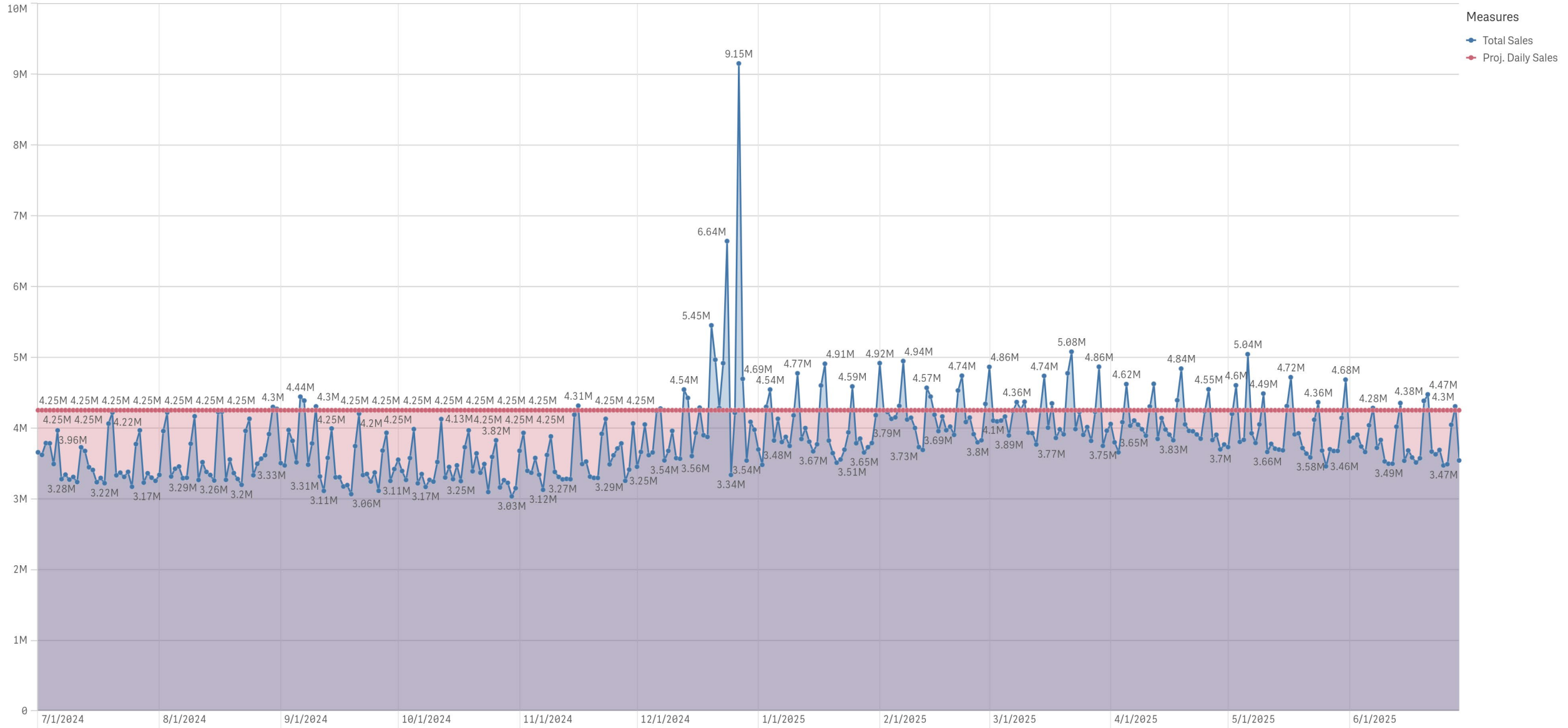

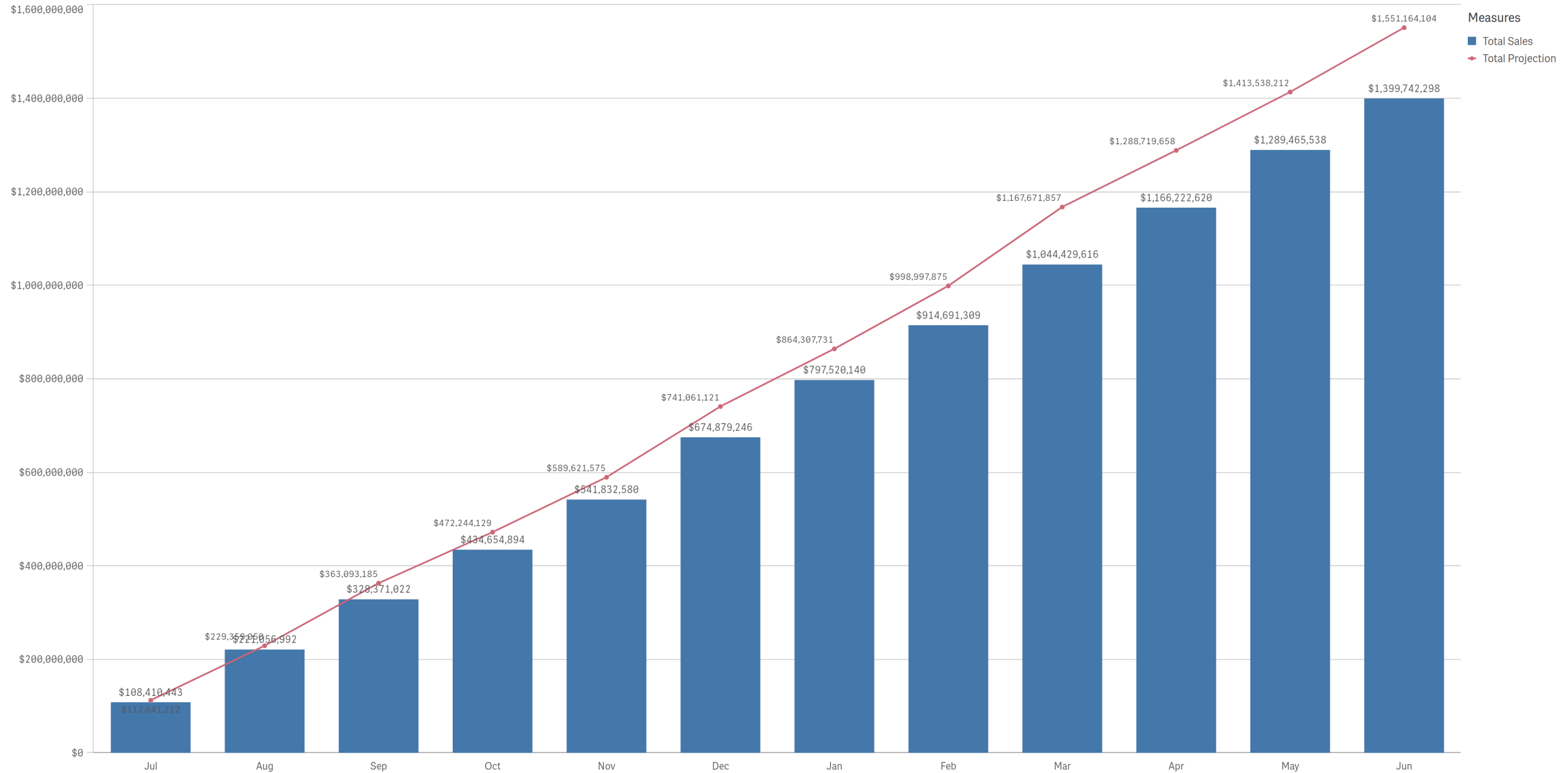
Daily Sales vs. Goal

FY 2025 Total Sales vs. Projection

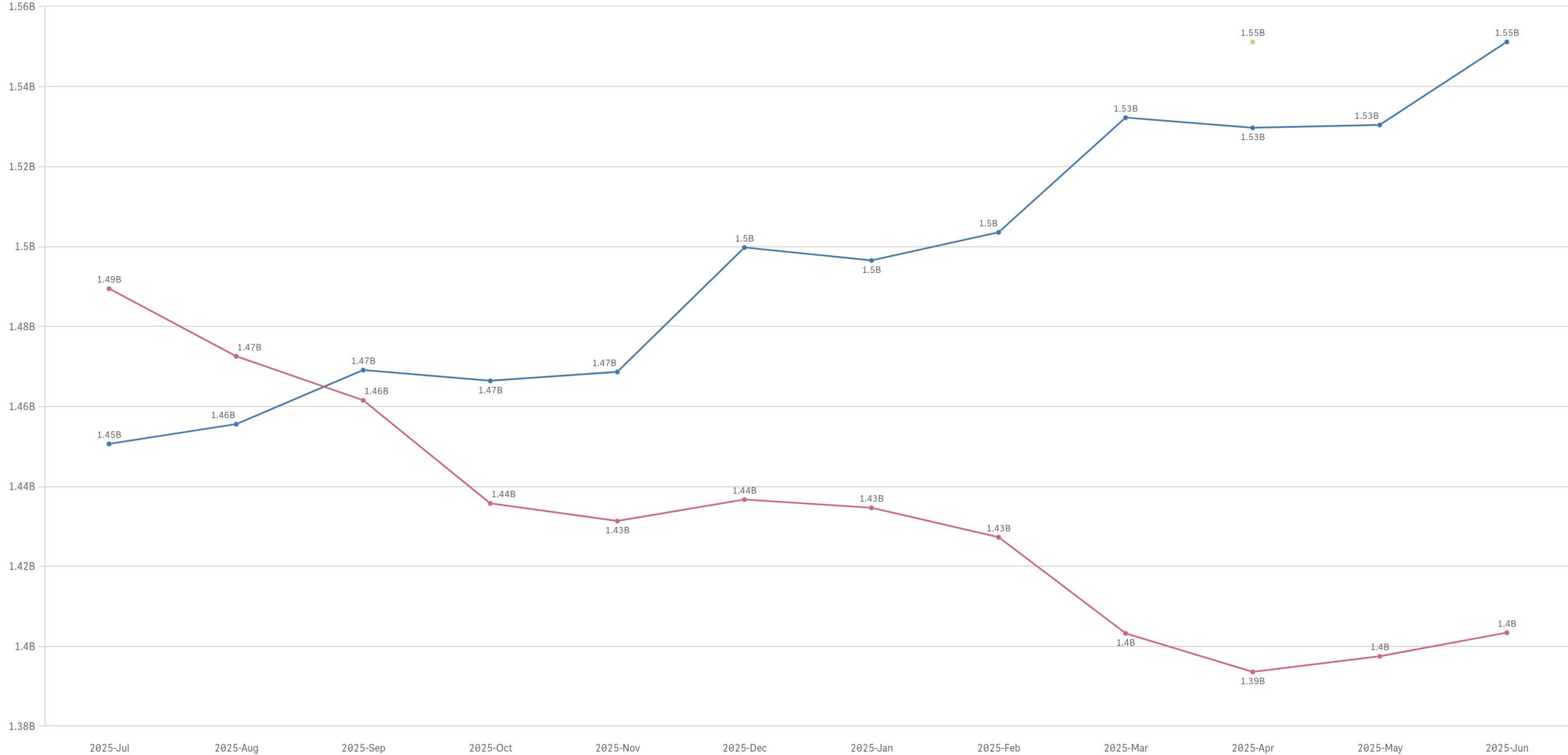




Rolling 12 Month Total Sales

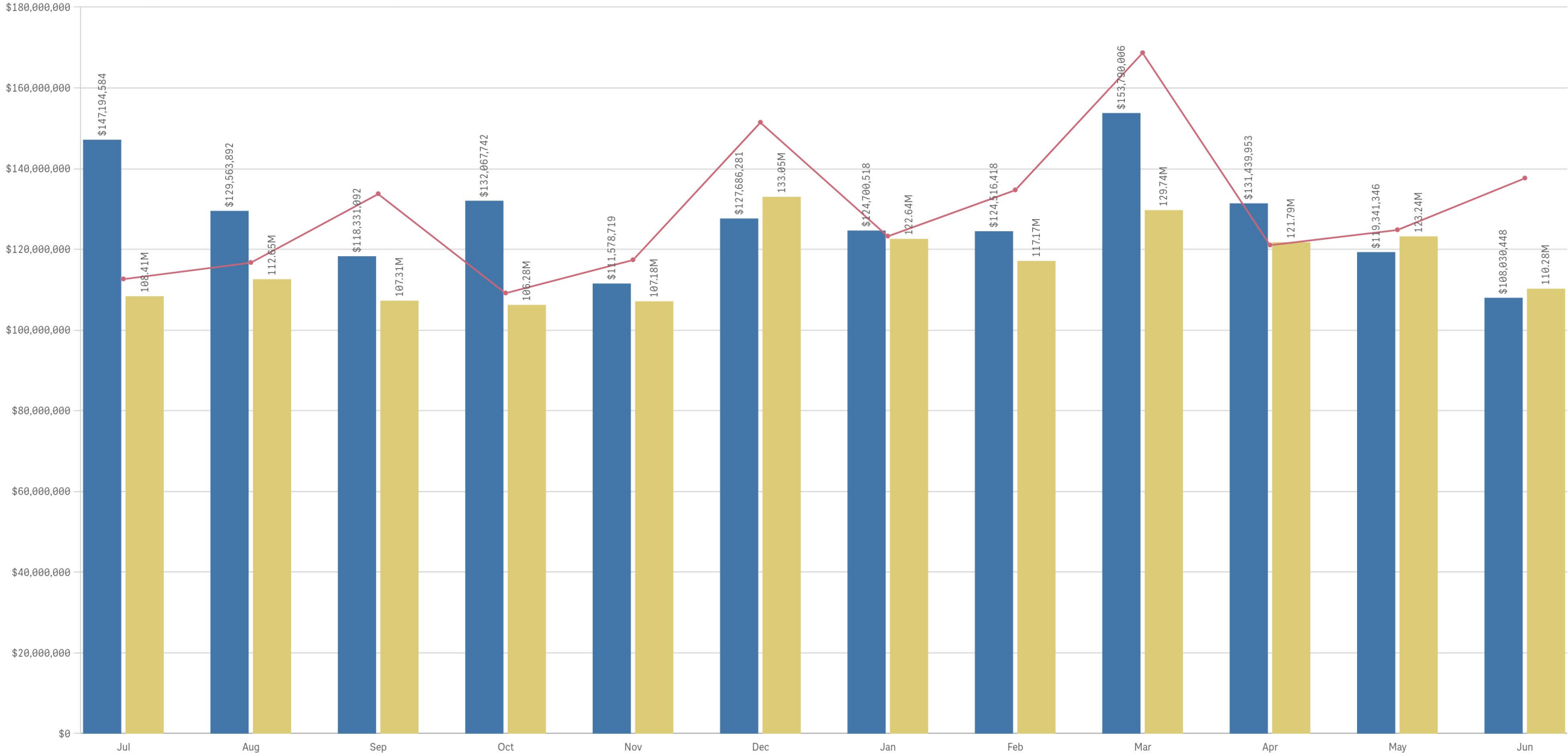

Sales FY 2024 vs. 2025 vs. Projection

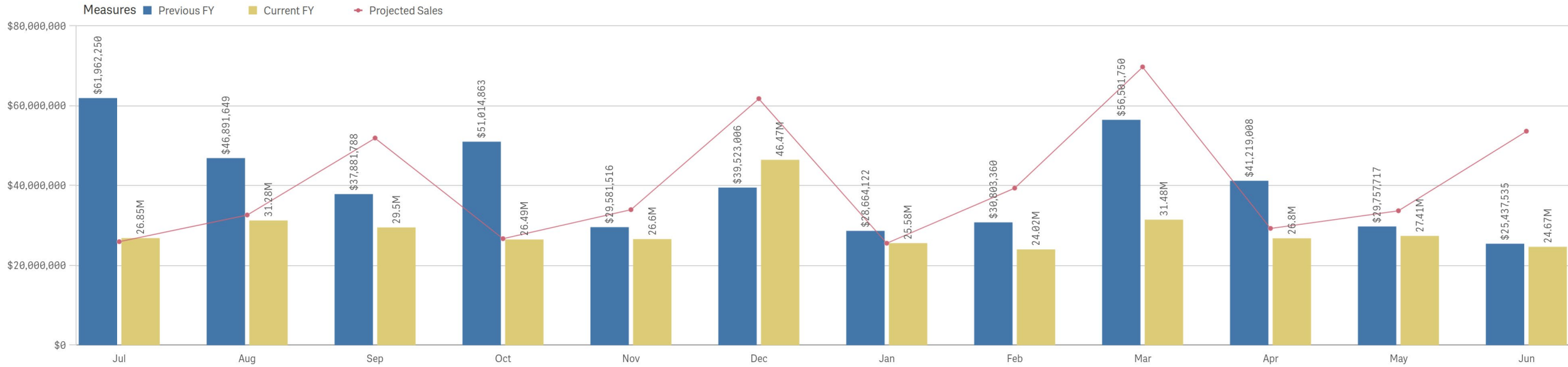

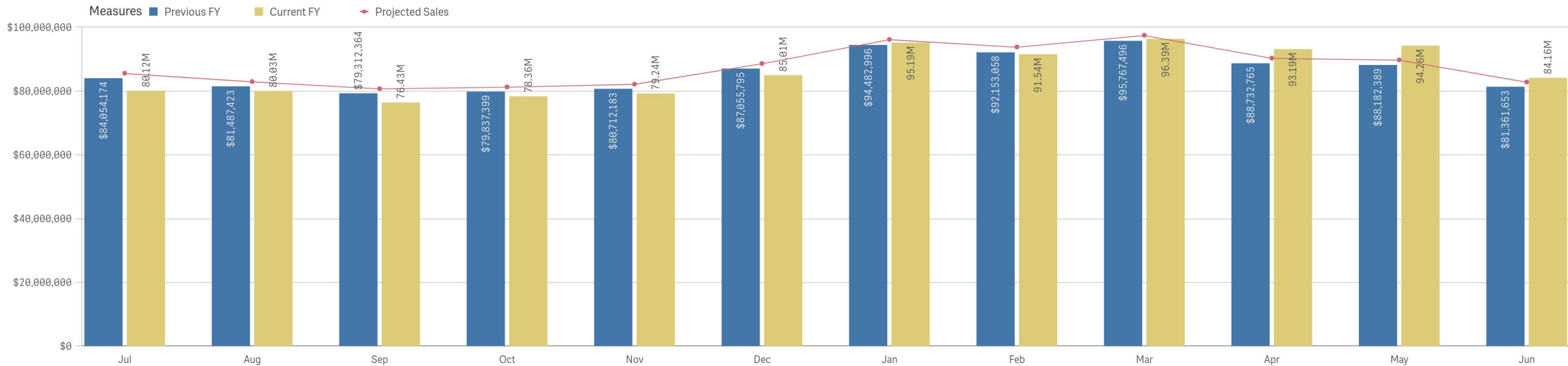

Draw Sales FY 2024 vs. 2025 vs. Projection



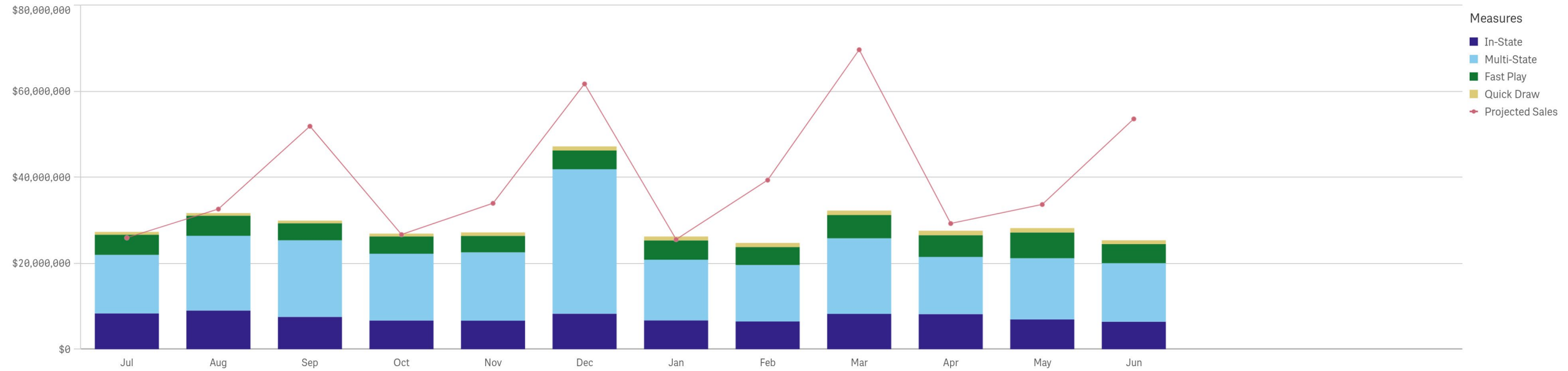
Instant Sales FY 2024 vs. 2025 vs. Projection



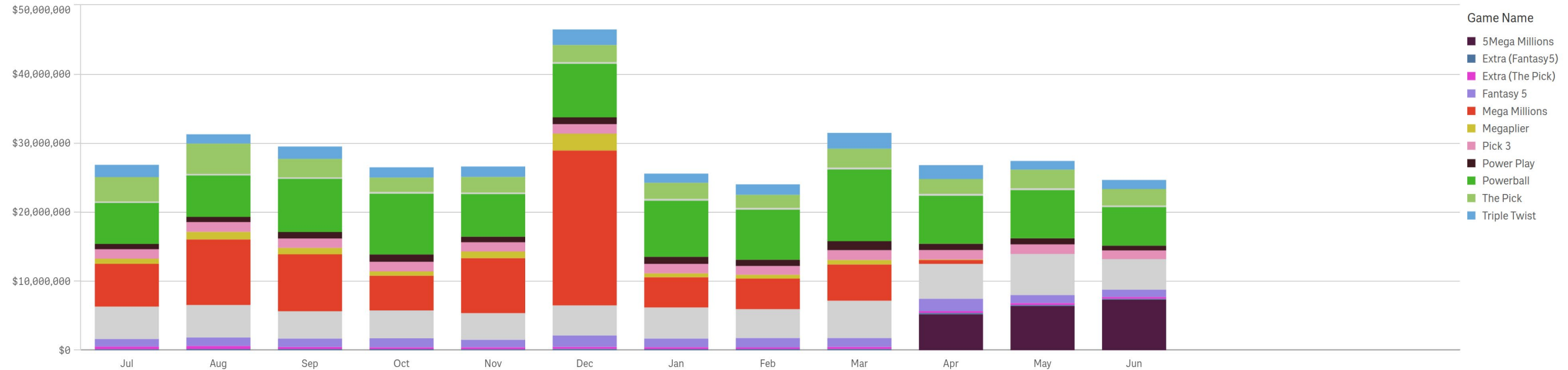


Draw Sales by Month

FY 2025 Draw Sales by Game Type

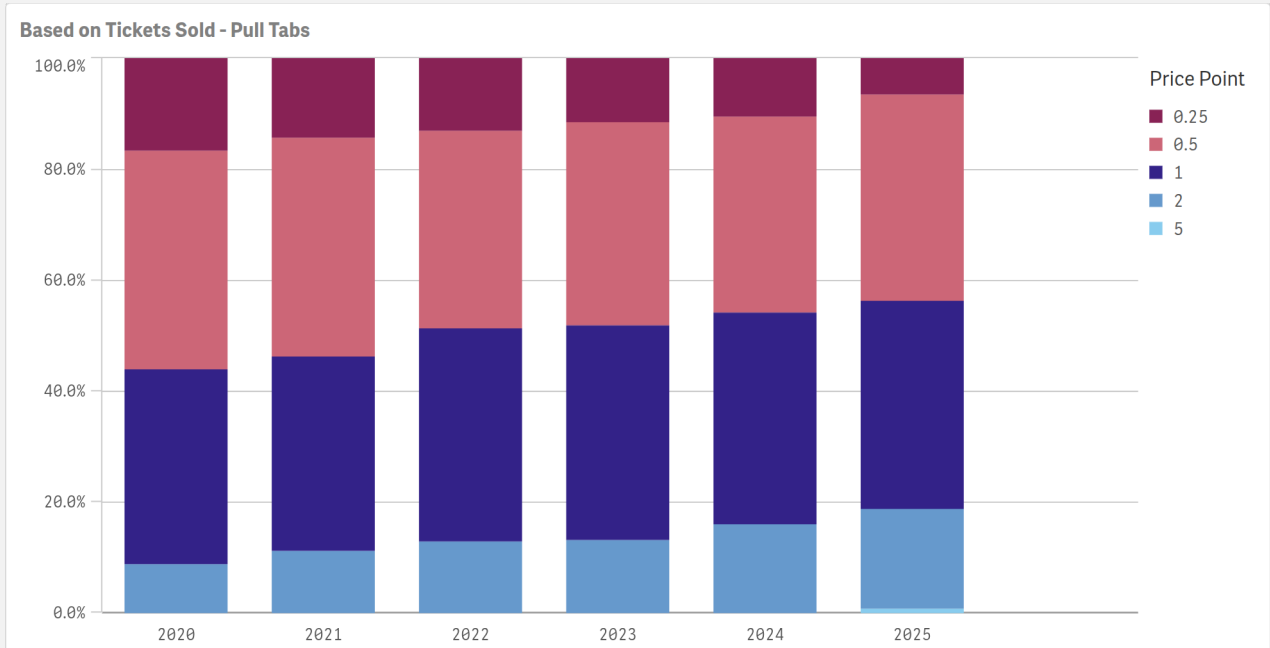
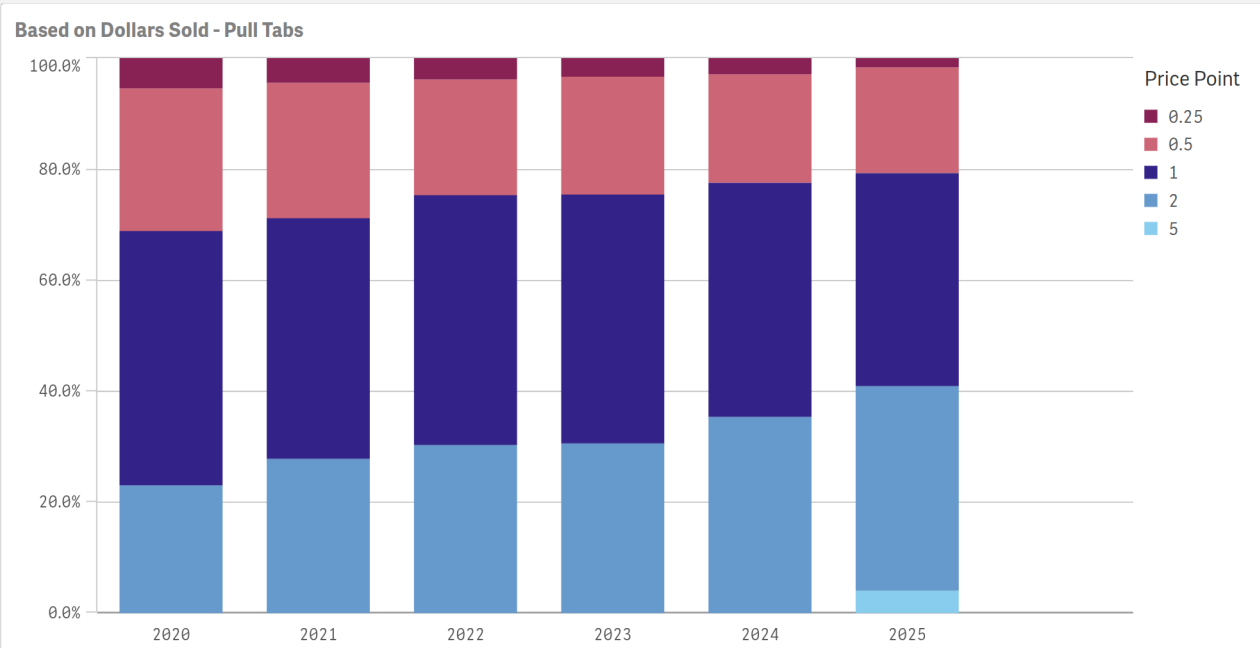
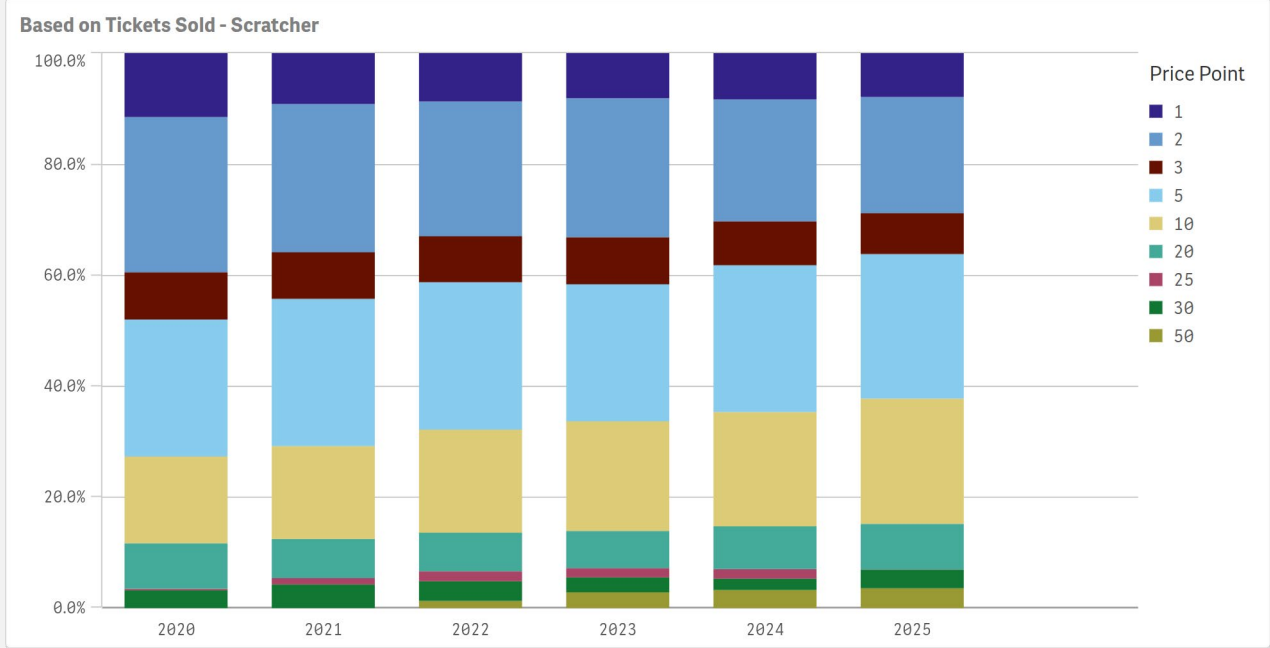
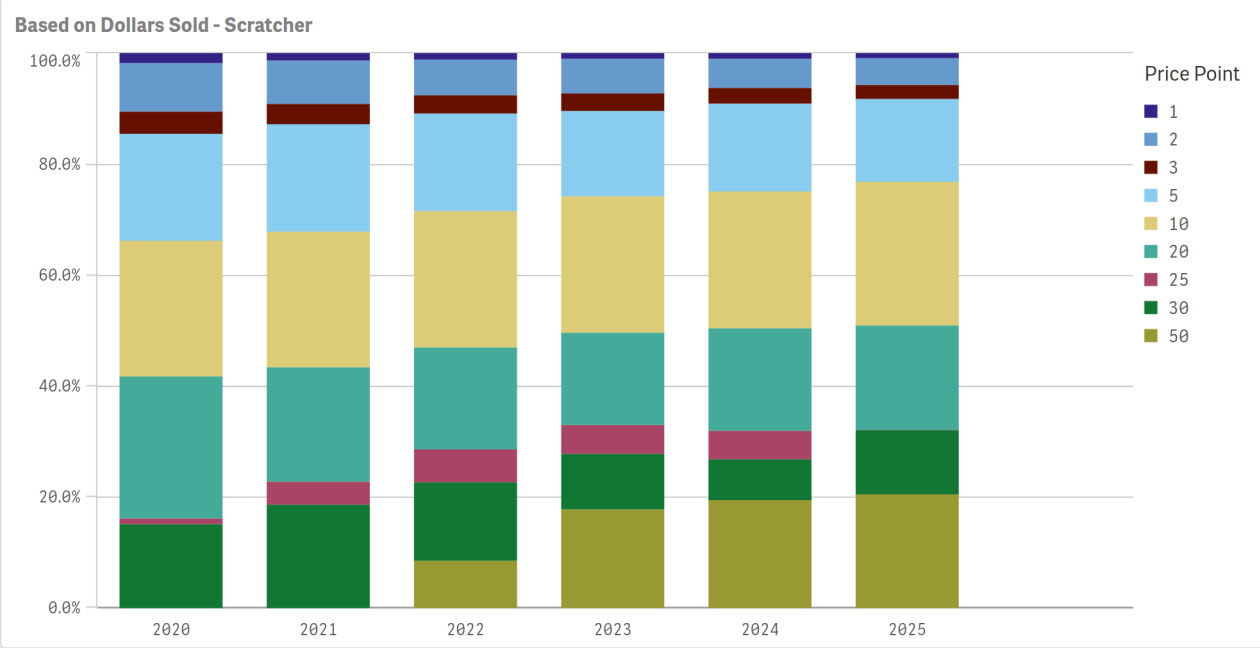


FY 2025 Draw Sales by Game



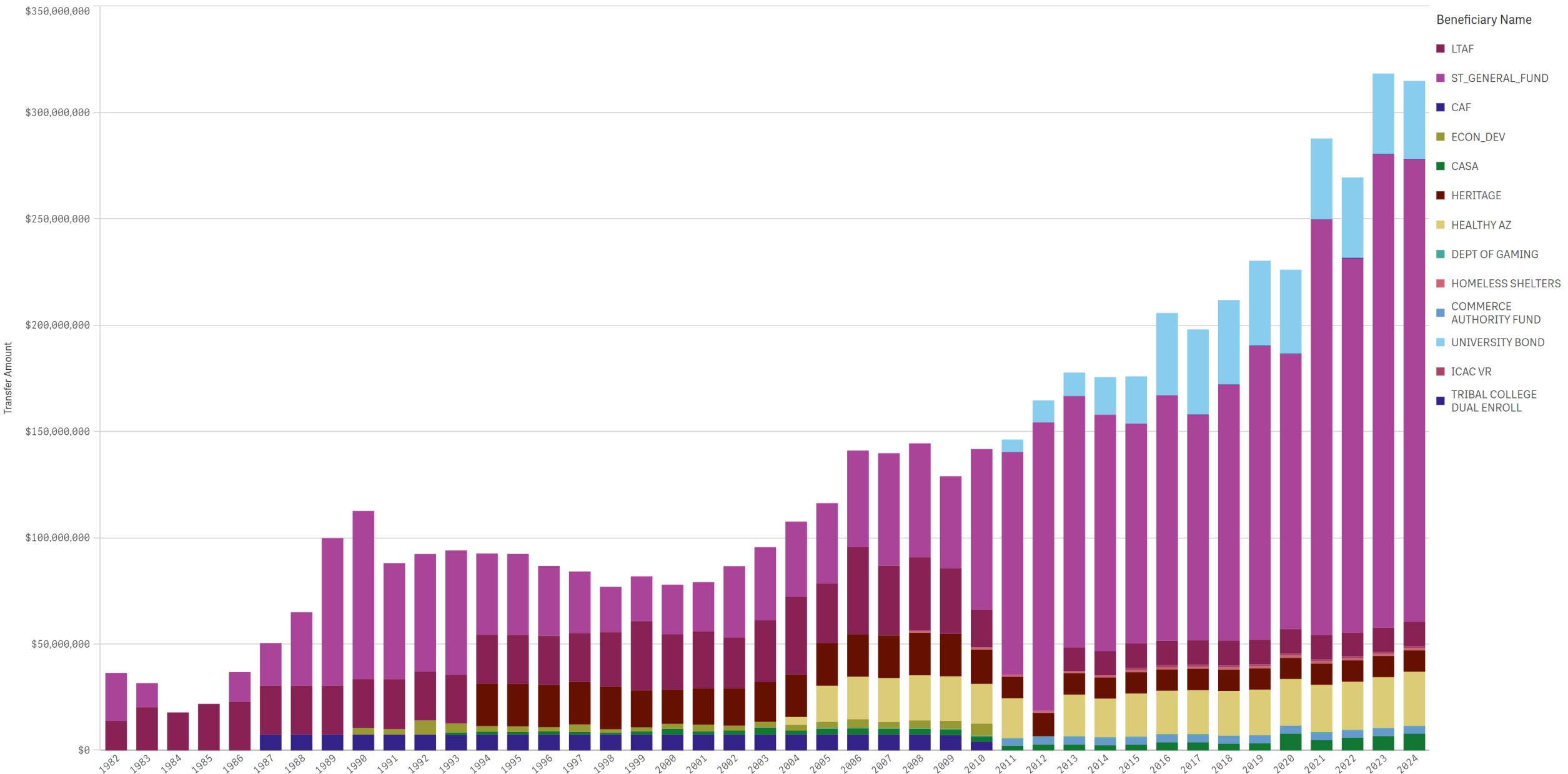


Sales by Price Point - Scratcher and Pull Tabs

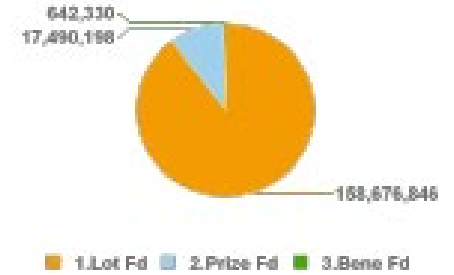

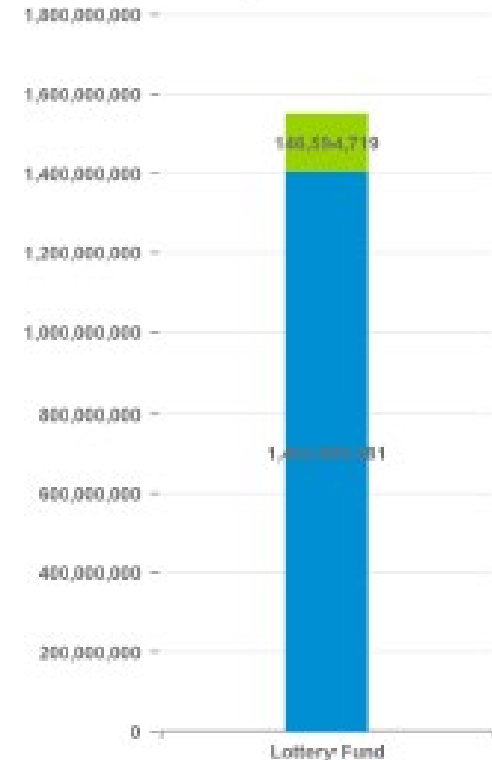

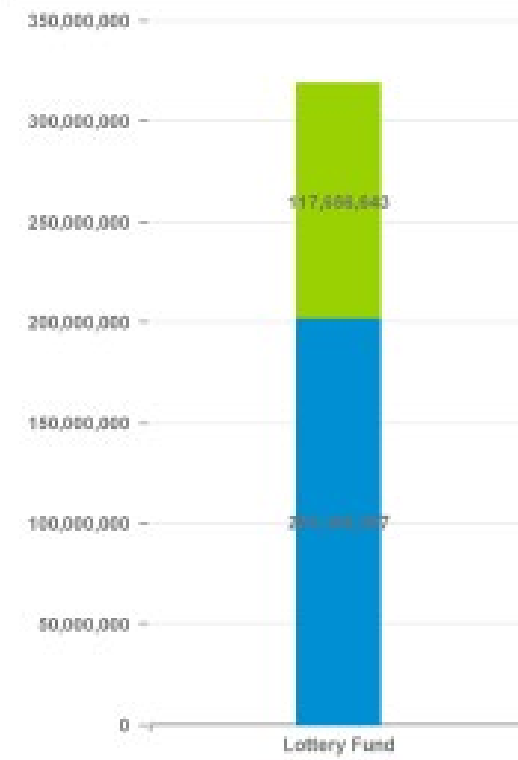

FY2025 - Product Review
Quarter 4 Review - July 2024 through June 2025

As part of a quarterly review process, we report to the agency on the performance of the individual Lottery Products, including draw, instant, and Fast Play. The information contained in this report includes the following:

- General overview through the current quarter of the fiscal year
- A top-line review of the sales performance of each product
- A summary review by price point for the instant games
- A top-down look at the top-performing instant games by revenue and tickets
- A review of new game introductions and game endings

General Overview

Sales through the fourth quarter of FY25 reached \$1,403,380,420 - a decrease -8.2% from the same period last fiscal year.

The Scratchers® contribution to total sales through the current fiscal quarter of the year represents 73.9%, an increase from the previous fiscal year. The market share for draw games is 20.9% of total sales, a decrease from the previous fiscal year. The market share for Fast Play grew this year, representing 3.9% of total sales. Combined Pull-tab sales represent roughly 1.3% of total sales, an increase over the previous fiscal year. These market shares and sales details can be visualized in Appendix B.

Scratchers Games

Sales of Scratchers through the current fiscal quarter have totaled \$1,036,599,685, an increase of 0.3% from the previous year.

Based on validations, players have earned more than \$748 million in prizes. The prizes paid calculated against the sales revenues equate to an average payout of 72.1%.

Forty two new games were introduced through the current fiscal quarter. Combined with the games carried forward, 110 games contributed to the sales revenues.

During this same period, forty nine games ended. Of these game endings, eight were because the last top prize was redeemed. The remaining games ended as part of the standard quarterly game-ending process because games were out of inventory or the intended sales period had ended.

Scratchers Sales by Price Point

Through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year, the category of \$20+ games represents 46.5% of Scratchers sales and 15.2% of tickets sold. The \$5-\$10 games represent 37.5% of Scratchers sales and 48.7% of tickets sold. The \$1-\$3 games account for 7.6% of Scratchers sales and 36.2% of tickets sold.

The charts in Appendix C show a breakdown across all price points for the most recent five years.

Top 10 Scratchers

The Crossword and Bingo-style games remain strong, with more than \$159 million in sales, representing 15.4% of total Scratchers sales. Regarding dollars sold, two of the Top 10 games are Crossword or Bingo-style games, and they also represent six of the Top 10 games in terms of tickets sold.

Fast Play Games

Sales for Fast Play games through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year totaled \$55,253,134, a 6.4% increase over the previous year.

Twenty new games were introduced through the fourth quarter. Combined with games carried forward, 40 games contributed to the sales revenues.

During this same period, sixteen games ended. nine ended because the last top prize was redeemed, and the remaining games ended because the intended sales period had ended.

Fourteen progressive games contributed to sales this year through the fourth quarter. Fast Play games with progressive top prizes sold \$35,948,992 through the fourth quarter of this fiscal year, an increase of 14.4% over the same period last year.

Draw Games

Total draw games sales through the fourth quarter reached \$292,749,021, a decrease of -31.5% from the same period last year.

Draw Game - Multi-State Games

Powerball® - Sales through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year totaled \$99,101,472 - a decrease of -48.9% from the previous year. The highest jackpot reached in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year was \$207. million on May 31, 2025.

Mega Millions® - Sales through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year totaled \$101,714,868, a decrease of -20.3% from the previous year. The highest jackpot reached in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year was \$112. million on April 18, 2025.

Draw Games - In-State Games

Triple Twist™ - Sales through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year totaled \$19,892,182, a decrease of -21% from the previous year. The highest jackpot reached in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year was \$1.67 million on April 18, 2025.

The Pick™ - Sales through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year totaled \$35,275,838, a decrease of -13.9% from the previous year. The highest jackpot reached in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year was \$2.9 million on April 5, 2025.

Fantasy 5™ - Sales through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year totaled \$17,508,237, a decrease of -9.9% from the previous year. The highest jackpot reached in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year was \$472 thousand on April 24, 2025.

Pick 3™ - Sales through the fourth quarter of the fiscal year totaled \$16,400,326, a decrease of -5.2% from the previous year.

Vending Machine Sales (Appendix D)

Total vending machine sales through the fourth quarter of FY25 was \$773,382,204, a decrease of -4.2% over FY24 sales of \$807,695,388. Currently, 2083 machines are installed at retail locations compared to 2081 in FY24. The average sales per unit increased to \$31,748 versus \$31,005 in FY24. FY25 sales from vending machines represented 55.9% of total sales, an increase from 53.4% in FY24.

Chain accounts represented 78.3% of total vending sales in the fourth quarter of FY25. Safeway leads all chain accounts with average machine sales of \$584,660. Followed by ALBERTSONS at \$572,435 and Fry's Food at \$568,526.

The new monthly out-of-stock goal for FY25 is 4.25%. We achieved that goal in one month of the quarter with averages of 4.43% in April, 4.39% in May, and 4.08% in June. The overall average for the fourth quarter of FY25 was 4.30%, down from 4.45% in FY24. The sales team will continue to focus on vending out-of-stocks in FY25.

Corporate Account Review (Appendix E)

- Major retail chains represent 47% of all Draw and Scratchers lottery accounts, up slightly from 46.9% in FY24.
- Convenience stores represent 33.8% of total accounts, while chain food stores represent 13.2%.
- Major retail chains comprise 70.9% of the total market share, with convenience and food stores accounting for 38.4% and 32.6%, respectively.
- Fry's Food Stores remain the leader with per-store average sales of \$1,381,972. Safeway follows at \$1,069,977, with Albertsons and QuikTrip at \$1,062,341 and \$886,312, respectively.
- Circle K accounts for 15.1% of the market share with 589 stores, followed by Fry's at 13.3% with 133 stores and QuikTrip at 9.7% with 152 stores.

Business Classification Review (Appendix G)

- Chain and independent convenience stores account for 54.4% of total Lottery accounts and 54.7% of the market share in sales. Chain and independent grocery stores account for 14.8% and 33.% of the market share. Instant Tab retailers account for 7.9% of total lottery accounts and 1.3% of the sales market share.
- FY25 comparison sales to FY24 show chain and independent convenience sales down 10.6%, while chain and independent grocery stores posted a decrease of 8.3%.
- The Instant Tab category is up 18% in the fourth quarter compared to the same period in FY24.

County Review (Appendix H)

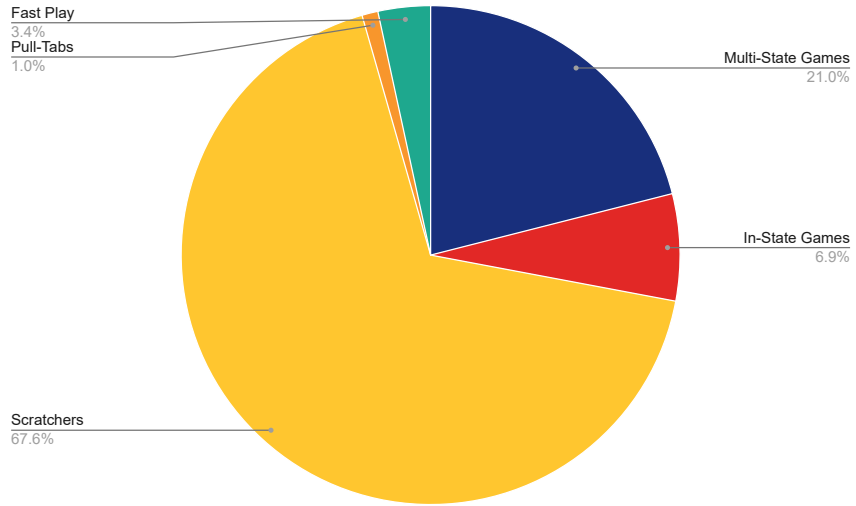
- The estimated per capita weekly sales for the fourth quarter of FY25 was \$3.57, a decrease from \$3.92 in FY24.
- Maricopa and Pima counties held a market share of 75.9% of total sales. Mohave, Pinal, and Yavapai counties' combined market share was 14.3%, and the remaining counties represented 9.8% of sales.
- Mohave County posted the highest weekly per capita sales at \$7.05, followed by La Paz County at \$6.63 and Cochise and Greenlee Counties at \$4.89 and \$4.75, respectively.

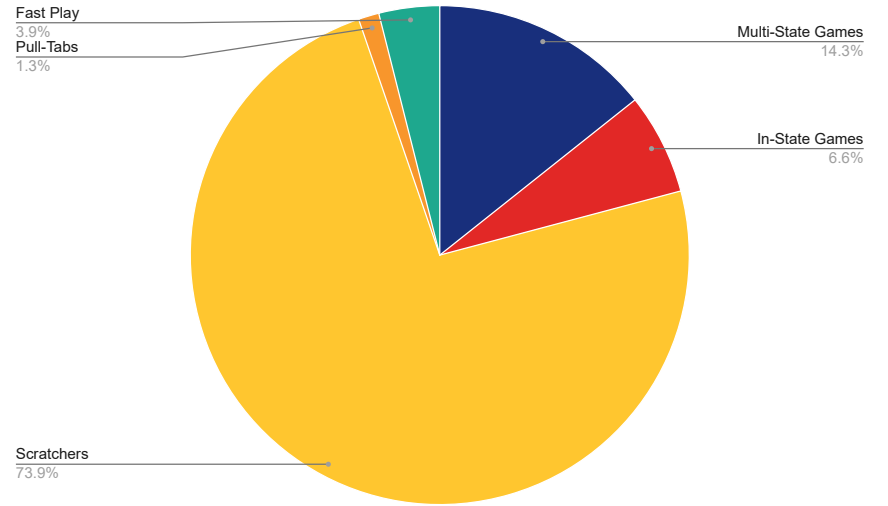

Fiscal Year 2024 - July 2023 through June 2024

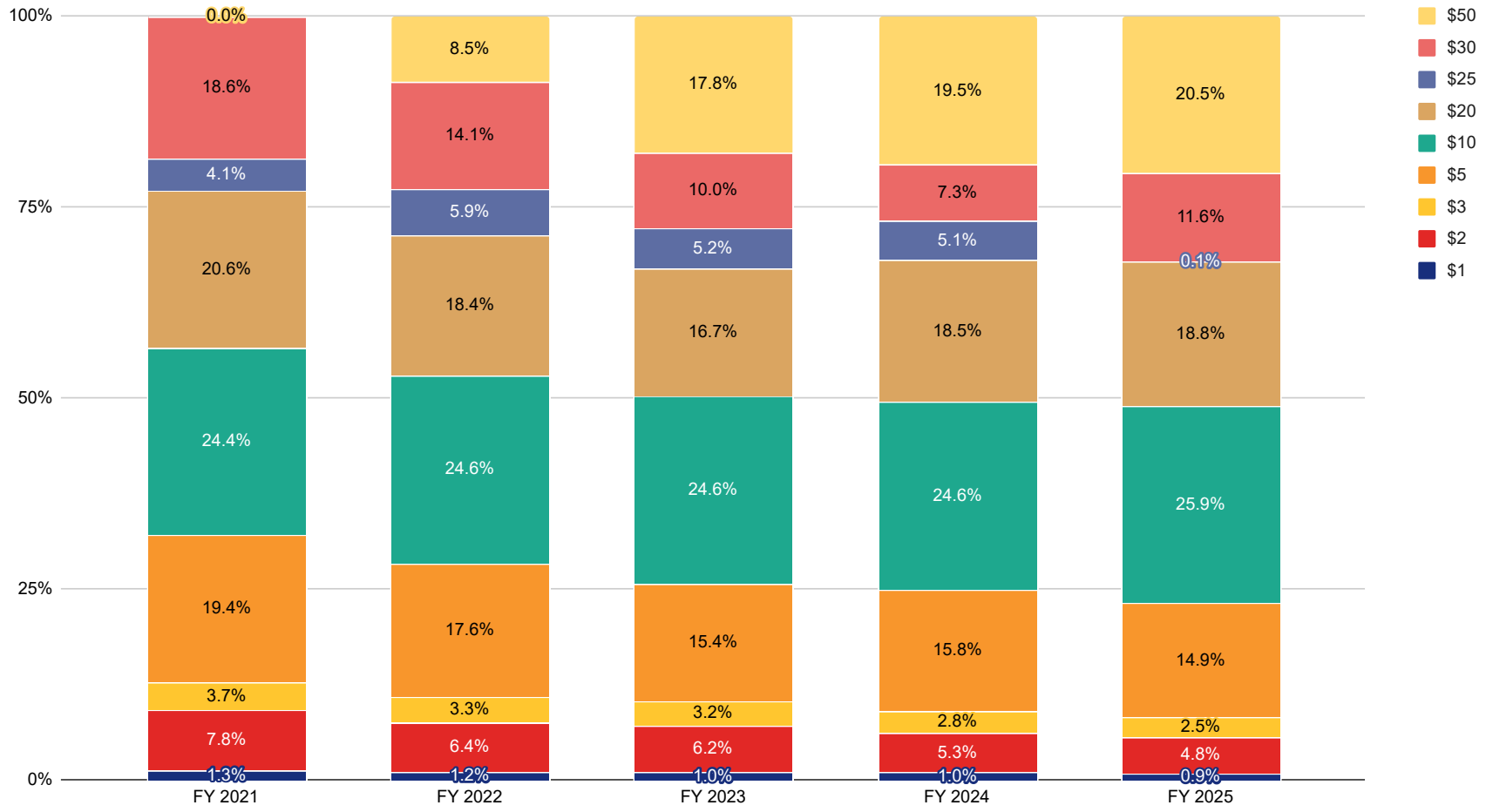

Fiscal Year 2025 - July 2024 through June 2025



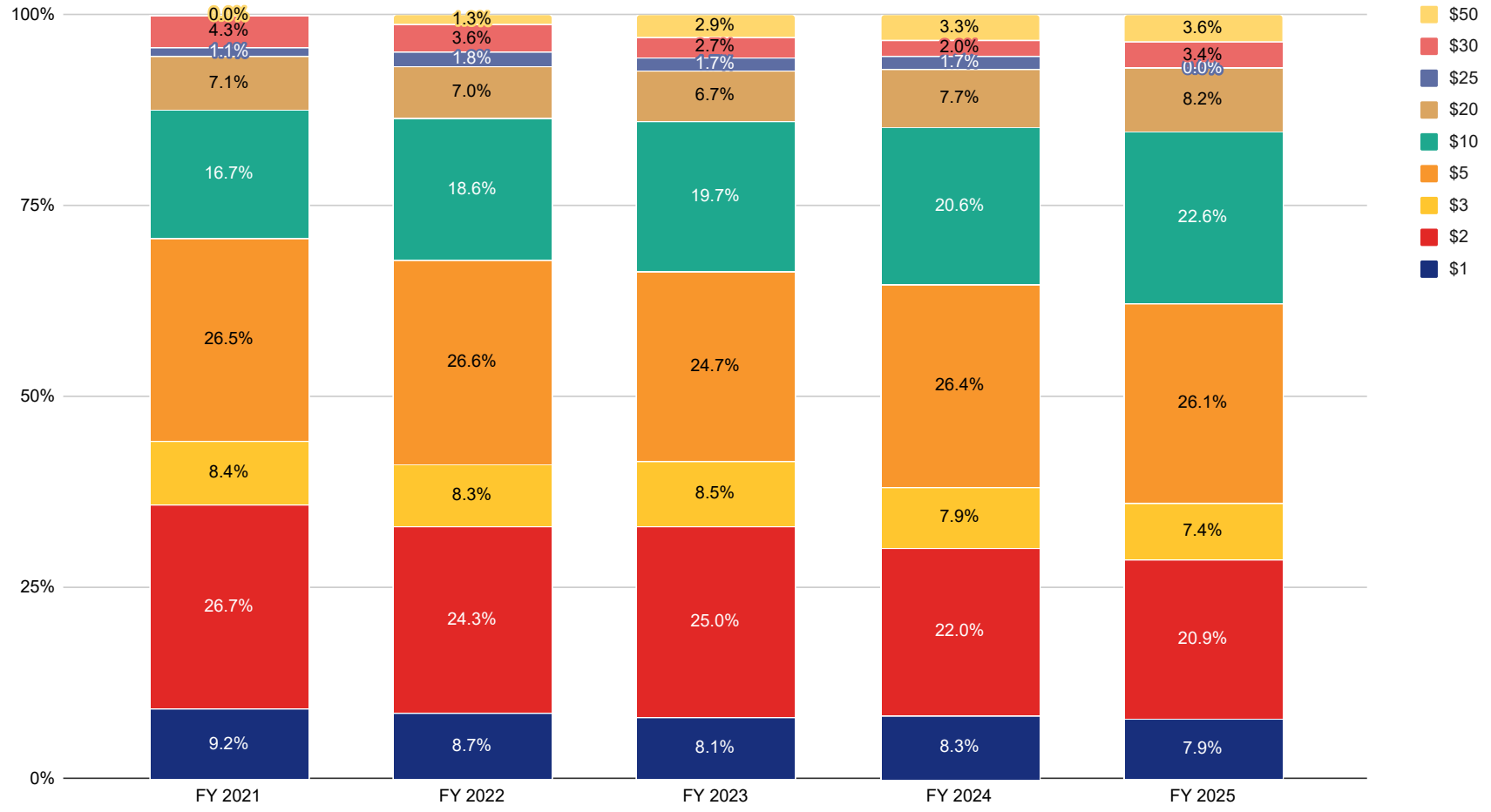
Arizona Lottery: 5 - Year Review by Price Point
